Since its inception, the group has continued to evolve into a unique and versatile ensemble that performs a wide variety of a cappella choral music for treble voices. Femmes de Chanson regularly performs at campus events and School of Music concerts.

MännerMusik is an undergraduate-led ensemble of tenors and basses from a variety of musical backgrounds. The group debuted at the 2008 Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols and has since performed at many events over the years, including those for previous UMD presidents. Their repertoire spans a wide range from Renaissance polyphony to barbershop.
