This final project emerged organically out of class discussions early in the semester and reflects each group's particular scope of action. Meaningful Connections is a chamber music course that addresses issues related to the potent field of chamber music, such as the art form's relationship to community outreach, social justice, entrepreneurship, and the creation of artistically meaningful musical events with important social ramifications and implications. Throughout the semester, students were guided in conversations about how to navigate the challenges of chamber music careers such as programming, networking and marketing, integrating other art forms in music events, diversity in music and how musicians can act as a social force.
