Spoiler alert—the show you are about to see tonight has an exuberantly happy ending. The true story this musical was based on ended with a lawsuit that awarded the plaintiff \$35,000 from the school district, who also agreed to a non-discrimination policy. It also ended with the high schooler switching schools because of continued bullying.

Unfortunately, there are many stories of oppression, discrimination, and violence towards the LGBTQ+ community. Many of these stories have become the source of groundbreaking theatrical pieces that are widely studied and performed—Angels in America, The Laramie Project, The Normal Heart, Stop Kiss, Torch Song Trilogy, and the list goes on. Much of the work that established the "Queer Canon" in the theatre was very much a response to the ignorance of the wider community of the injustices the LGBTQ+ faced on a daily basis. Happy endings in these works were few and far between. Work created about the LGBTQ+ community continuously focused more on the trauma collectively experienced by individuals, with reenactment of trauma being celebrated and praised. What was rarer, was the complicated joy of community that was simultaneously being built while the lives of Queer bodies were actively being torn down.

Today, despite countless new legislations attacking the LGBTQ+ community, particularly the Transgender community, the work being made is embracing the joy that is fostered despite the dangerous rhetoric that is being stoked. Pieces such as Fat Ham, Everybody's Talking About Jamie, Kinky Boots, and even on TV with Heartstopper and Our Flag Means Death—celebrating the Queer identity is becoming the norm. The complications are still there, as is the trauma, but now the other side of the coin is being revealed: that truly being yourself is something that should be celebrated and honored. And that there is a community ready to embrace and support your full self.

I have had the distinct pleasure of directing seventeen actors, and working with a creative team and crew, who are all brave enough to choose joy despite the challenges that come with simply being a person in this world. They have chosen joy at every rehearsal, during long nights, and even when dealing with difficult personal events. Working with them almost every day has given me hope that the future of theatre, and more importantly, of society, is going to be more than ok. They are dreaming up a future that is filled not just with joy, but with laughter, forgiveness and radical empathy. It is my wish that everyone who witnesses their work is as brave as they are, and joins them in not just dreaming our culture forward, but ensuring that those dreams become a reality.

"All I wanted was the same chance to enjoy my prom night like any other student, but my school would rather hurt all the students than treat everyone fairly...This isn't just about me and my rights anymore—now I'm fighting for the right of all the students at my school to have our prom."

These are the words of Constance McMillen. In 2010, Itawamba High School in Mississippi canceled prom due to Constance's plan to attend it with her girlfriend. She filed and won a lawsuit against the school, but eventually had to transfer schools after being harassed by other students. This case, as well as many other real-world cases similar to this one, became the initial inspiration for the musical you are about to experience.

The Prom had its first production in 2016, and then went on to make its Broadway premiere in 2018. The show was in its pre-Broadway tryout when Donald Trump was elected president, causing a producer to question the existing lyrics in Trent's solo song, "Love thy neighbor," in which he says, "love thy neighbor trumps them all." The writers embraced the irony of that line with that particular named individual and his actions contradicting its sentiment. They kept the original lyric to bring the social moment to light in the show's future iterations. The Prom's performance in the 2018 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade featured the first same-sex kiss to be broadcast as part of the parade, with some viewers responding on social media with negative thoughts and even making threats (of varying degrees) to cast members. Anti-LGBTQ+ sentiment does not end on social media, however.

There are currently numerous anti-LGBTQ+ bills being introduced in the United States. Legislation targeting LGBTQ+ rights has doubled in numbers in this incomplete year of 2023, compared to the entirety of last year. These bills attack access to healthcare by blocking trans youth from getting gender-affirming care, target education through curriculum censorship and "forced outing" bills, as well as ban drag shows and other crucial aspects of queer life. These bills, as well as violence against LGBTQ+ folks, particularly Black trans folks, bring the urgency of fighting for the LGBTQ+ community into focus. As we witness a story that ultimately ends in joy and celebration tonight at a college that was just voted the most LGBTQ+ friendly university in the nation, we are reminded of the need to continue the fight for the LGBTQ+ community. We can continue to stay informed on LGBTQ+ issues, get involved with local organizations that are working to fight back against these bills, reach out to our local legislators through email or phone and educate ourselves and others—particularly those who may not know about the harmful effects of these bills.

This show reminds us of the importance of accepting each other, accepting ourselves and fighting for the right for Queer people to live. And not just to live, but to thrive. O'Shae Sibley was a gay Black dancer who was recently murdered for voguing with his friends at a Brooklyn gas station. During this performance, we witness Emma and Alyssa sing that they "just wanna dance" with each other. May we all continue to work towards a world where queer dancing in public does not end in tragedy but can be what it is—an act of celebration, thriving and resilience.
