Fereydoun Farrokhzad is invisible to everyone apart from, mostly, Iranians, because nobody apart from them ever has to think about him.

In 1992, the Iranian pop sensation and refugee Fereydoun Farrokhzad, "Iran's Tom Jones," was found brutally murdered in his home in Germany, only six months after playing to sold-out audiences at London's Royal Albert Hall. The case was never solved.

This witty, fast-paced and cutting-edge production cuts to the heart of the biggest true crime case that you have never heard of. It is an investigation into both an iconic murder and an investigation into the nature of the investigation itself.

Part free-wheeling comic lecture, part podcast and part play, accompanied by live music, *Things Hidden* is a thrilling ride down the rabbit hole of Wikipedia and murder mystery podcasts, sorting through the tangle of information available online in a post-colonial world to reveal the limits of the search engines in solving a decades-old cold case.

Things Hidden builds on the success of Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran which made its US debut at Public Theatre's Under the Radar Festival in 2021, before playing at Sundance Film Festival and being selected as one of Helen Shaw's "Best Theatre of 2021" in Vulture Magazine.

It is the third and final production in a trilogy of plays examining how technology, global politics and fracturing identities are changing the world (*The Believers are but Brothers*; *Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran* and *Things Hidden Since the Foundation of the World*).

THE JAVAAD ALIPOOR COMPANY

THE JAVAAD ALIPOOR COMPANY (TJAC) makes ambitious, risk-taking, contemporary theatre, rooted in experimental and multi-platform practice. Their work leans into complexity to interrogate the key issues of our time. They ask questions and make connections, led by internationalist values and spearheaded by diverse voices, to understand the world we have made and can make differently.

TJAC was founded in 2017 by writer, director and artist Javaad Alipoor. Growing out of his experience running community theater projects in Bradford (UK), it evolved as an innovative production company that works with interlocutors around the world. Over the past six years, under Javaad's artistic direction, TJAC has grown to develop a signature brand of theater that explores the complexities and contradictions of the 21st century informed by its manifesto, with a global outlook. Past productions for the stage include a trilogy of plays examining how technology, global politics and fracturing identities are changing the world (*The Believers are but Brothers*; *Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran* and *Things Hidden Since the Foundation of the World*) and *Made of Mannheim*, a trilingual production for the stage inspired by Schiller's *Jungfrau von Orleans*. Past digital work includes the podcast *The Colour of our Politics*, exploring how anti-racism in the UK today has been shaped by a rich history of activism and resistance, and *The Believers are but Brothers* commissioned by The Space for the BBC in 2019.

TJAC's accolades include the 2017 Fringe First Award for *The Believers are but Brothers*, the 2018 Stage Innovation Award for *The Believers are but Brothers*, and the 2019 Fringe First Award for *Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran*. In 2020, following the digital adaptation of *Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran*, Javaad Alipoor was selected to be included in Columbia University's archive of twelve digital storytellers shaping the 21st century.

JAVAAD ALIPOOR

JAVAAD ALIPOOR is a British-Iranian writer, director and performer. He founded The Javaad Alipoor Company in 2019. The Company's most recent work, *Things Hidden Since the Foundation of the World*, opened to five-star reviews and sell-out audiences at Battersea Arts Centre and HOME, Manchester. *Things Hidden Since the Foundation of the World* then began a world tour, opening in the USA at the University of Michigan and Australia at The Sydney Opera House. Previously, Javaad Alipoor wrote, co-directed and performed in *The Believers Are But Brothers* as an international touring show, and wrote and performed in the TV adaptation for BBC Four. Its follow up, *Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran*, also co-created with Kirsty Housley, won a Fringe First Award before the COVID-19 lockdown led it to transform into an immersive digital experience. The digital version opened at Battersea Arts Centre, before it toured to Sundance Film Festival and The Public Theatre's Under the Radar Festival. Together with Chris Thorpe, Javaad Alipoor wrote and directed the trilingual theater production, *Made of Mannheim*, which had its world premiere with Nationaltheater Mannheim and Theaterhaus G7.

Javaad was Resident Associate Director at Sheffield Theatres from 2017 to 2018, where he directed a new version of *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest.* Prior to this he was Associate Director at Bradford's Theatre in the Mill from 2015 to 2017. Javaad is involved in politics and activism, co-founding The International Alliance in Support of Iranian Workers, The Syria Solidarity Campaign and a Bradford-based network supporting EU migrants after Brexit. His writing about politics and culture has been featured in The Guardian, The Independent and The Stage. His plays have been published by Oberon and Nick Hern, and his poetry by Art in Usual Places.

CHRIS THORPE

CHRIS THORPE is a writer and performer from Manchester. His work tours and is produced in the U.K. and internationally. He has collaborated with Javaad Alipoor on several projects, including dramaturgy on The Believers Are But Brothers and Rich Kids: A History of Shopping Malls in Tehran, as well as co-writing and dramaturgy on Things Hidden Since the Foundation of the World. In 2021, Chris and Javaad also co-wrote and directed Made of Mannheim for Nationaltheater Mannheim, Germany. Chris also has ongoing collaborations with artists and companies including Rachel Chavkin, China Plate, Yusra Warsama and Portugal's mala voadora. Work as a writer includes Victory Condition, and the film What do You Want Me To Say for the Royal Court, There Has Possibly Been an Incident and The Mysteries for the Royal Exchange and Beowulf for the Unicorn. Upcoming work includes a new, as-yetuntitled large scale piece co-written with Javaad Alipoor, The Soprano Always Dies, for mala voadora/Portuguese National Opera, Always Maybe The Last Time for the Royal Court and A Family Business and Talking About The Fire for Staatstheater Mainz/China Plate-two shows about nuclear treaty negotiation and disarmament, developed with diplomats, activists and NGOs, touring the UK and internationally in 2024-2025. As well as writing, Chris also mentors writers with a particular focus on working with young people in the care system, post-prison groups, and addiction recovery.

BENJAMIN BROCKMAN

BENJAMIN BROCKMAN is an award-winning lighting and set designer who has worked both in Australia and internationally.

NATALIE DIDDAMS

NATALIE DIDDAMS is a dramaturg, director and academic researcher based in Manchester. Notable productions include *A Series of Metaphors About a Plague* (HOME, Manchester), *The Believers Are But Brothers* (International Tour), *B!RTH* (Royal Exchange Theatre) and *Thesmo* (National Tour). Natalie has a PhD from Manchester Metropolitan University, and is an Assistant Professor at the University of Warwick. Through her research, Natalie is a leading voice on the intersection between comedy and contemporary politics, and regularly hosts workshops and performances aimed at empowering participants through comedy. Natalie is an Associate Artist of The Javaad Alipoor Company, Trestle Theatre and the International Schools Theatre Association (ISTA).

RAAM EMAMI

RAAM EMAMI is an Iranian musician, writer, actor and podcast host. He started his musical career in the undergrounds of Tehran. With a great deal of international press behind his band, including features in The New York Times, MTV, Billboard, NPR, CNN, VICE, NME and Vanity Fair, Raam paved the way for a new generation of aspiring underground Iranian artists. In January 2018, Raam's father, Kavous Seyed Emami, a prominent environmentalist, was arrested in Tehran under false charges of espionage. Two weeks after his arrest he was killed in Iran's notorious Evin Prison. Raam and his family attempted to flee Iran, but the authorities detained his mother and confiscated her passport. Raam and his brother were allowed to leave, but his mother was held hostage in Iran for 582 days. Besides his live shows with his band, Raam has also channeled his creative energy into a one-man storytelling performance called "Departure" about his family's experience and his father's legacy, woven together with his music. He also has a podcast in Persian called *Masty o Rasty*, since its inception in 2020 the show has had over 40 million streams.

ME-LEE HAY

ME-LEE HAY composes for film, TV, dance and theater. A Malaysian-born Chinese-Australian, she has had works shown across multiple platforms including Netflix, Amazon Prime, Tubi, commercial TV channels and mainstream cinemas plus international planetariums and film festivals including Canne and Sitges. Off the screen, Me-Lee has been commissioned by leading arts companies of Australia such as Sydney Dance Company's PPY, Sydney Theatre Company as well as performing at the Sydney Opera House. Me-Lee received her debut nomination at the Sydney Theatre Awards in 2024 for Best Composer and Sound Designer in Independent Theatre (Face of Jizo) as well as her first AACTA (Australian Academy of Cinema and Television Arts) nomination for Best Original Score in Film in the same year (Suka).

Classically trained in piano and cello, Me-Lee is a graduate of the Australian Film Television Radio School (AFTRS), an Associate Composer Representative of the Australian Music Centre and was the Vice President of the Australian Guild of Screen Composers for four years. She composed for her first ballet in 2024 entitled *GOLD* presented at Parramatta Riverside Theatre (Sydney), a magical children's ballet set in the Australian bush during the historic gold rush era.

BARRET HODGSON

BARRET HODGSON is an award-winning video artist and digital projection designer. His company, Vent Media, was created after his master's degree in Collaborative Arts Practice at Trent University, Nottingham. Vent Media specializes in creating and staging visual media for live performance including theatre, dance and music events, gallery installations, film productions and architectural projection. Barret has continued to refine his practice, working on cutting-edge techniques and hardware to create a huge array of visual digital experiences. Clients and commissions have included the BBC, 59 Productions, Game City, Sadlers Wells, Red Bull, DreamThinkSpeak, Warp Films and Glastonbury Festival. Barret has toured nationally as a VJ for many years and has collaborated with DJ Yoda, Fat Boy Slim, Ghostface Killah and Roni Size, amongst many others. His theater and dance collaborations have had international recognition including touring in Asia, North America and across Europe.

Between 2015 and 2023, Daniel held the position of Executive Director/CEO at Shopfront Arts Co-op., an arts organization based in Sydney, Australia. Daniel serves on the board of Beyond Empathy, a grassroots organization that uses community, arts and cultural development practice to create new works and as chair of the board for Theatre Network NSW, the peak theater body for the state of New South Wales in Australia. He is a member of Create NSW's Artform Advisory board for Theatre & Musical Theatre. Daniel believes creative expression is crucial to building strong community ties and is passionate about utilizing the arts as a tool of empowerment for adults and Young People alike.
